I didn't attend church until I was 14. A friend asked me to go with her because she didn't want to go alone. I went out of curiosity and I was attracted to the acceptance that was shown by the church members so I continued attending. While my reason for going to church was more social, I eventually became involved in helping with the kindergarten Sunday school class. On the outside I seemed committed, but I had barely even opened my bible at home. The church did not teach about having a personal relationship with Jesus, however, and I didn't know any better. I figured that I was a basically good person.

A few years later I met my husband, Jim, we were married, and five years later we welcomed our first child, Lindsay. I continued attending this church, but Jim didn't want to go. He would go on Christmas and Easter, but he had no desire to go any other time. His priority was sports and drinking and couldn't get up on Sundays so I continued to go alone. Our marriage was suffering almost to the point of divorce.

After years of this, my sister-in-law invited me to a Bible study. I was nervous because I didn't know much about the Bible. On the first night, I began talking to the lady seated next to me. She shared her testimony about accepting Christ and the relationship she had with Him. As she spoke, I realized that all my preconceptions were wrong! What I had was religion and ritual, not a relationship! This precious lady spoke the truth to me. I finally understood what I needed to do. When I got home I knelt down, alone in my living room, and surrendered my heart to Jesus! I immediately felt peaceful, like a weight was lifted off my shoulders! I was so excited to tell the lady about how her testimony had encouraged me to make that huge commitment to the Lord. I called the group leader to get contact information for the woman, but she didn't know who I was talking about. The next week, no one from the group knew who she was and the woman never showed up again to the Bible study. I believe God sent an angel to help me make the most important decision of my life!

I was like a sponge! I studied the bible, read devotionals, took notes at Bible Study, and dove headfirst into a new relationship with God. As God changed me, Jim watched from the sidelines. He didn't want to hear anything about God and didn't want me to think he was going to change too. One Saturday evening, Jim hurried out the door for another night of sports and drinking. I knew I couldn't endure this for the rest of our marriage. I decided that he was going to have to choose between his family and his sports and drinking. I never imagined that divorce would be an option for me, but it seemed imminent.

Meanwhile, in my Bible study, I was learning about being unequally yoked. Our lesson described our marriage and I didn't have any idea how to change Jim's heart. Others in the group told me to pray for Jim and to give him over to God. God was powerful enough to handle Jim's hard heart. I began praying every day for God to change Jim's heart. I claimed God's promise: "I will restore to you the years the swarming locusts have eaten" Joel 2:25.

After praying this way for four years, along with my sisters in Christ, a friend invited me to a special service at her church. I asked Jim to go so I wouldn't be alone in a new church. Reluctantly, he said yes. After the service, Jim commented on the message. I wanted to go back to this new church to hear more of this powerful preaching. The next week, Jim agreed to go with me again. He commented that the pastor had said things that spoke directly to him.

Then Easter Sunday arrived. Jim and I attended both morning and evening services! All throughout the services I was praying that Jim would accept Christ into his heart. When the pastor gave the altar call after the second service, I kept my eyes closed. I didn't want to mess things up by catching Jim's eye and have him feel embarrassed. Later that night, I asked Jim what he thought about the invitations to receive Christ. To my amazement, he said that he tried to fight it, but he couldn't keep his hand down and he had prayed to receive Christ! My prayers were answered!

Soon, Jim joined a Bible study group to get to know who God is. On top of that, God convicted him about his excessive drinking and he gave that up. He began sharing his experience with everyone he met. I was so happy to finally have a family rooted completely in Christ. Today, we attend Radiant Church and continue to grow together in our faith. At every chance we get, we are volunteering, attending community groups and Bible studies, and striving to grow closer to God. God has been so good to us! He pursued both of us and restored our marriage!




Near the beginning of the pandemic in the spring of 2020 I was furloughed from my job. I didn't know for how long and I didn't know what would happen in the meantime. I really felt stirred by God, even among the panic of uncertainty, to critically consider doing some of the things that I've wanted to do but shelved for time's sake. It was a stirring and an awakening. I decided to launch my own ministry based around a concept of repurposing used shoes from the greater Kalamazoo community and getting them into the hands of the unhoused and needy. 'New life for shoes and people', is our mission. We launched in June, right around the time that I decided to do RSM and to date we have collected close to 445 pairs of shoes and handed out around half of them. We've had the opportunity to partner with Trenches Community Church, Ministry with Community, First Day Shoe Fund, and Kindness Acts in serving the local community. We've really seen God move in Restored Soles because we are now being approached by individuals who I don't personally know and organizations that want to partner going forward. In 2021 we hope to partner alongside fostering and adoption agencies to serve the younger with footwear and with veterans agencies in addition to the unhoused in our community.

In late 2020 I was using a neighborhood social media app when I came across a posting by a local author who was going to publish his first children's book and was seeking an artist to illustrate it. I had grown up drawing and doing illustration but I had peaked around high school when I decided that I wouldn't pursue it in college since my older sister already had. I hadn't done much of it for years since I was then focused on my wife and then my children. But something in me decided to throw my name in for consideration to this author. To my surprise, he reached out right away and asked for a sample of a character in his story. I drew up what I envisioned the character and sent it back to him. After a few days of excruciating waiting, I got the reply that I had actually been chosen out of 20 some local artists. And so in 2021 I will be illustrating a children's book, have my name on it, and have half ownership of it upon publication. This actually works in tandem with an idea that I've been developing for a local Christian art-based ministry that I would like to launch soon. Only God can take a skill He has blessed you with and bring it back for His glory after you've set it aside.

I have had health struggles for the last 3 years that I have been in and out of the hospital for and seen doctors and medical staff to try solve. Most of the

scary things have been ruled out, but I still struggle daily with different types of body and head pain. Within the past year, there has been a lot more that I've learned about what could be going on through environmental allergies and food sensitivities and surgery to correct a deviated septum, but unfortunately it still hasn't been resolved to the point of being healed. I've prayed and I have been prayed over and I've had others pray for me for this to be miraculously removed from me, but God in His wisdom hasn't done so yet. I share to celebrate a different kind of victory. The thought of doing RSM scared me because I thought I might not be able to physically or mentally handle taking it on. I frequently fatigue very easily and I can have a difficult time concentrating because of my health, but I discovered that God would attach a grace to His calling. That I might not be firing on all cylinders as I serve God, my family, my career, and ministry, but that's okay. I don't need to be perfect to be used by God in RSM and ministry because His strength is made perfect in my weakness. It's a daily lesson, often forgotten and frequently learned again, but it's a good one.

I find myself oddly grateful for what the world and our nation is experiencing. Of course I am praying for all of the countless families that are broken due to the loss of their loved ones to COVID-19, and I am constantly thinking of and praying for the men and women that are working long hours in our medical facilities, putting their own lives at risk to take care of those that are in need. To me, they are heroes and our nation's finest. But despite all that this virus has taken from us, I am also grateful for what it has given.

For me, my family, and many others, this time in the wilderness has been an unprecedented opportunity to seek God's face and rest fully in Jesus like never before. It has been a time that so many have turned their lives over to Christ and begin a new journey. In many cases, nothing but such tragedy on a global scale could have pointed them back to Christ like this.

The COVID-19 virus has been the challenge flag that we see coaches use many times in football games. The challenge flag, when used well, can be a total game changer for either team. It is a pause in the normal play that demands a review of what has just happened. After the flag is tossed, we see course correction as the officials make a call to right the wrong. The tossing of the COVID-19 flag forced me to pause and take a serious look at my life with Jesus before the virus hit. It was an opportunity to course correct and get back into relationship with Him. Without that course correction, I don't know how I could have gotten through the hard days at work in the recent months.

I am the Director of Environmental Health at the Kalamazoo County Health & Services Department. Generally, we have programs geared to protect our citizens from negative environmental exposures and minimize illnesses related to adulterated foods (food borne illnesses). As a result of COVID-19, I have also been asked to be the Kalamazoo County Logistics Chief in charge of Personal Protective Equipment (PPE). This job involves obtaining PPE and distributing it to EMS, hospitals, long term care facilities, law enforcement, shelters, and visiting medical staff. Trying to purchase PPE was difficult not only due to the PPE shortage but also because we are on a very limited budget. N-95 masks, procedure masks, hand sanitizer, gowns, gloves and face shields were in high demand, and we had little hope that we could get a supply that matched the needs. There were many times that our PPE supply was running so low that we were not able to provide specific PPE to those in need. Countless times I prayed for God to provide what was impossible for us to get on our own.

When we hit yet another week of barely having enough PPE to give to those in need, I reached out to Radiant. Through Radiant Church, God provided my agency the needed PPE so that we could assist our hospitals, shelters, long term care facilities, and EMS with their fight to safely do their jobs. God used the shortage to teach me to trust Him more than I ever had to in the past. With that trust, Jesus blew me away as I saw Him strategically place people in our path to supply more than \$250,000 in PPE to my agency in less than three months; PPE that my wife has used working in the COVID-19 wing at Borgess Hospital!

I am grateful for this time in the wilderness and for Pastor Lee, the staff at Radiant, and for all that call Radiant home. I have seen their faithfulness in giving and volunteering during this time provide essential PPE to those that are on the front lines fighting this horrific virus. Each and every effort, from the smallest tithe to the biggest blood drive have made a life-altering difference to those that have been affected by COVID-19. Some of whom did not even know that Radiant Church existed until now. They know now, and they are grateful for you.
